BYA Driver Support Program

Transport services are a big issue across the Warren-Blackwood region for young people. In the regions, being able to drive is a necessity for getting to employment, spending time with friends and in some cases be able to attend training facilities,

Obtaining their drivers licence gives our youth an opportunity to explore other options with fewer restrictions.

Blackwood Youth Action (BYA) has identified that some young people across our region have limited access to a suitable vehicle or to someone with the necessary experience to accompany them in achieving the required 'logbook' hours.

The BYA Driver Support Program has been created to address this issue by supporting young people to complete the 50 hours of supervised 'logbook' experience with one of program's Volunteer Driving Mentors.

BYA has partnered with Regional Youth Driving Education (RYDE) to create the Warren-Blackwood RYDE program. This program provides software specifically for

RYDE which allows BYA Driver Support Program to book, coordinate and link with young people with mentors, and allows service providers and support workers to connect

young people with the program.

BYA has the ability to deliver the sessions in Bridgetown and in Manjimup. It has two vehicles, a manual and an auto; these vehicles were purchased in 2022 and are fully insured and well maintained through this program.

The program has already had good support from people interested in mentoring but there is always a need for more. Each session is 90 minutes long and there is no minimum or maximum number of sessions a mentor must do.

The mentors are the key to the success of this program, helping young people to become more responsible and independent. The mentor role can be a rewarding experience as they support young people with their hours, share knowledge about negotiating roads, and build supportive relationships with the young person.

There is a cost to the young person of \$15.00 per session which goes towards the running of the program. Balingup Small Farm Field Day

The Balingup Small Farm Field Day is back on the Balingup Town Oval after 4 years – there being a smaller one in 2021. It is being held on Saturday 15th April 9am till 4pm.

The first Balingup Small Farm Field Day (BSFFD) was held in 1991 and is a not for profit, community event driven under the auspice of the Balingup Progress Association (BPA) – run by a Committee of volunteers with the help this year of a Coordinator.

The BSFFD concentrates on the activities of small farms with sections on livestock suitable for small holdings, small scale farm machinery and equipment, horticulture, small farm information, gourmet foods from local products, local crafts and a limited number of market stalls featuring predominantly local produce.

The BSFFD has guest speakers talk on topics related to the Field Day Theme –

'Small Farms – Big Ideas', This year Chris Ferreira will be the key speaker covering a range of topics from creating a Firewise garden through to drought resistant, sustainable productive land management education. Also there will be talks on making great compost, beekeeping basics and biosecurity. Plenty of activities for children including an animal petting zoo, camel rides, climbing wall and sand pit are on offer.

There will also be the opportunity to watch sheep dog trials, sheep shearing and demonstrations including wood turning, black smithing, log splitting plus more accompanied with local music playing on stage.



TALISON - SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITY



Craig's Corner - With Craig Dawson

For those that don't know me I'm the General Manager - Operations with Talison Lithium Pty Ltd (**Talison, Company**) and I look forward to every month sharing with you insight into what is happening at our Greenbushes Lithium Operation and updates on our projects and community activities.

Last month Talison was pleased to be able to facilitate feedback sessions with community members from Bridgetown-Greenbushes and surrounding Shires. The sessions were facilitated by an external consultant (ERM Pty Ltd) who was the same consultant previously engaged by Talison to undertake the Community Perceptions Survey (CPS) back in August 2022.

Coincident with the CPS feedback sessions, ERM also coordinated a number of employee and community "open houses" and input sessions for the purposes of Talison's Social Impact Assessment (SIA). The sessions were well attended and ERM is now compiling all the input received ahead of presenting a report to Talison in the near future. A warm heart felt thank you to all community members who participated.

I am proud of the investment Talison makes at a local level in the Greenbushes area. Which is why I was surprised by the relatively minimal awareness, and to an extent criticism, some attendees at the 'Open House' sessions had regarding Talison's contribution to the community. In light of this, I thought I would take the opportunity to provide a brief overview of some of the ways in which Talison contributes to the community, and society in general, both locally and more broadly:

- The Greenbushes Lithium Operation (Site, Mine) supplies approximately 20% of the worlds Lithium which is critical in supporting the Global clean energy transition. Without the Mine's inputs, the clean energy transition would be significantly hampered in its progress;
- the Mine is the largest single employer in this part of the South West with more than 1,000 direct jobs and a very significant number of indirect jobs; and
- Talison supports local youth by means of its Apprentice and Traineeship programmes. For the 2023 year, Talison has engaged a total of six (6) apprentices and eight (8) Trainees.

In addition to Talison's ongoing local sponsorship and donations programmes, Talison is proud to be a significant contributor to the economy of the South West region, Western Australia (WA) and Australia through the payment of employee salaries, rates, royalties and taxes:

- Income taxes paid to the Federal Government for the 2022 year were in excess of \$900 million;
- other taxes paid to the Federal Government for the 2022 year were just under \$20 million;
- Royalties paid to the WA Government for the 2022 year were in excess of \$260 million;
- other rates and taxes paid to the WA Government for the 2022 year were in excess of \$5 million.
- the annual base salary paid to Talison employees (not including contractor employees who work
 at the Mine) living in the Shires of Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Donnybrook-Balingup, Manjimup,
 Boyup Brook and Nannup (based on January 2023 employee numbers which will increase by
 40-50% during the 2023 year) is estimated to be of the order of \$45 \$50 million; and
- Talison is a major ratepayer within the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes accounting for somewhere between 5.0-7.5% of annual rates revenue raised by the Shire.

For the 2022 year, Talison's small donations/sponsorship programme supported 71 individual community groups with both cash and in-kind donations to the value of \$255,000. The Talison Board of Directors has approved a doubling of the funding pool available for supporting local community groups through Talison's small donations/sponsorship programme for the 2023 year.

Two important projects funded directly Talison in 2022 were the installation of the Greenbushes Primary School Shade Sails (\$40,000) and the Balingup Primary School undercover area (\$36,000).

The Talison Environment and Community teams contributed in excess of 400 hours of their time in supporting local community groups. I look forward to Talison's Community and Environment teams continuing to engage collaboratively with community groups for the betterment of people living within the South West. Talison will continue to explore opportunities to be involved with groups and projects which bring benefits to local communities.

Talison also has a number of key Community Partnerships which it sees as being of tangible benefit to local communities including:

• three (3) year \$600,000 partnership with Blackwood Youth Action;

- four (4) year \$61,000 partnership with the Chamber of Minerals and Energy WA to facilitate a digital technologies programme for schools in the Warren-Blackwood region;
- five (5) year partnership with Edith Cowan University for the provision of internships for students;
- one (1) year \$50,000 partnership with the Greenbushes Primary School;

three (3) year \$90,000 partnership with Foodbank WA; and

• three (3) year partnership with St. Georges College Perth for the provision of accommodation scholarships for country students who wish to study in Perth.

I am immensely proud of the part that Talison and its employees play in supporting both the global clean energy transition and the local communities in which it operates. This is not to say that Talison can't do better – Talison always strive to ensure that it improves on a continual basis and Talison is continually looking for ways to better engage with, and support, local communities.

As some of you will have seen, roadwork has commenced for the upgrade to Stanifer Street between the South Western Highway and Greenbushes which is required to ensure safe traffic flows associated with the new Mine Services Area (MSA).

A Traffic Management Plan has been enacted which limits light vehicle traffic along Stanifer Street during the day whilst the works are being undertaken.

Talison acknowledges there were some teething issues at the start and that these works have and will continue to cause disruption to community members and recognises the inconvenience that will result – but the works are necessary to ensure the long-term safety of road users.

Congratulations to Tom Sherwell who achieved five (5) years of Service during February.




collection of animals calling the property home. It was also conveniently divided up into several smaller paddocks which was ideal for keeping horses." Nicola explained.

Revitalised Rabbit Hole

Moments in Time by Martin Sherlock will be the March exhibition at the Rabbits Hole Gallery.

It will be available for viewing from the 3rd to the 30th March. Open from 10am to 3pm Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and 9am to 2pm on Saturday and Sunday.

Martin is a highly productive artist who is producing an abundance of art, this being his third exhibition in the past nine months. Producing a lot of art has the added benefit for Martin to develop and hone his skills.

Steampunk art includes the kind of artwork which is created by aesthetically blending the essence of the industrial age instruments like cogs, gears, clockwork and machine parts with Victorian art form.

Martin continues, "The improvements at the Rabbit Hole Gallery have come about since becoming a not-for profit organisation.

"With the new artist member system there is always an artist on rooster, though usually it has been two or three artists on hand at most times. A shire grant has gone towards better lighting, and painting of the walls: the improvements have made the gallery larger, brighter and have revitalised gallery."

The Rabbit Hole is on Hampton Street opposite the Freemason's Lodge and is always worth a visit.

"Last year forty-four cars started the event with forty cars finishing.

"Its not a race, it's a wonderful life experience like no other, although sometimes the drivers just cannot help themselves.

"Along the way we get to experience some of WA's most beautiful and remote places with support of an experienced crew, private caterers and the opportunity to see the impact of our fundraising has along the way.

"There really isn't anything quite like it. The camaraderie and devotion each basher has speaks for itself, hence why we see so many regular participants returning to the event year after year."

Ladies in Black

The Bridgetown Repertory Theatre next production is a musical, Ladies in Black.

The Musical is by Carolyn Burns and Tim Finn, based on Madeleine St John's 1993 novel, which studies women working in fictional department store.

Set in Sydney in the 1950s, a post war city 'a buzz with change', the musical tells the story of school leaver Lesley who joins the sales staff in a fashionable department store.

Over a summer that changes her life, she befriends the colourful denizens of the women's clothing department. Each of the characters are on the precipice of change; facing independence, working for a living and coming to terms with what it means to be a woman. A coming-of-age story for both the women and for the city they live in.

Robert Benson-Parry is directing the production and he tells us how the musical is progressing, "To bring this production to the Bridgetown stage it will be a collaborative effort, I have Wayne Paget-Steadman who is the choreographer and Julia Robinson as the music director.

"We have fourteen cast members, five of those are male roles. The leading role of Lesley will be played by a seventeen-year-old Ella McGuire.

"In our pre-production read through of the script the cast members giggled and laughed at our societies attitude changes which have taken place since the 1950s, some of attitudes back then have now become politically incorrect and are very amusing today.



"There are several stories running through the musical making it very interesting, but it's not the usual boy meets girl musical story line. We enter the world of Goode's through the eyes of Lesley, a seventeen-year-old recent high school graduate who has dreams of going to university, and becoming a poet. She renames herself Lisa on her Goode's job application form; There is Fay, a 29-year-old woman who is worried she might never marry; Patty, whose husband has a fear he might be sterile; Miss Jacobs, a kind older woman with a mysterious past, and Magda, a Lithuanian refugee who has re-settled, along with her Hungarian husband, in Mosman. Magda is mocked and feared in equal parts by her co-workers - they call her the 'crazy continental'."

This very interesting Australian musical which will remind us all of how far our society has developed in such a short time. The musical will be staged over eight performances from April 20^{th} to 30^{th} , a performance which should not be missed.
