Wash Against Waste Trailer assisting with Low Waste Events

It's time for the Wash Against Waste Trailer to be out and about in our community!!

Transition Bridgetown acquired the Wash Against Waste Trailer in Oct 2022. It is fully equipped with a marquee, folding trestle tables, ceramic coffee mugs, melamine/hard plastic plates and bowls, stainless steel cutlery, urn, wash bowls, trays, tea towels, aprons and signage. In fact, pretty much everything you could possibly need to cater for 150 people or more, at any event that provides food and hot drinks!

The WAW trailer originally came from the Margaret River Regional Environment Centre who received a Keep Australia Beautiful grant in 2016 to have it designed and built. They owned and utilised it over a four year period, deploying it at local markets and events as a driving force for reducing plastic waste as well as working to educate the community and visitors to the area about the damage disposable plastic does to the environment and oceans.

Whilst the Wash Against Waste Movement first came into being as a way to reduce/eliminate single use plastics at events, this has now progressed to reducing all general waste from eco food and drink containers, many of which have a plastic or waxed lining and are not compostable in normal household composting bins. They contaminate our recycling bins due to food remains and grease, hence becoming general waste.

There is a 5 tub washing system for utilising the items in the WAW trailer...Continued on page 12

Major Funding Boost for the Learner Driver Program

Thousands of additional disadvantaged community members will now be able to obtain a driver's licence thanks to a major funding injection towards the State Government's landmark Driving Access and Equity Program (DAEP).

The State Government has announced a further \$15.5 million in additional grants for the program, taking overall investment since it was launched in 2022 to \$26 million.

In response to high demand for the grants, the total funding amount was boosted by the inclusion of an additional \$4.2 million from the Road Trauma Trust Account.

The additional funding will be provided to twentyeight organisations across the State, including in the Great Southern and South West for the first time.

The project funded in Warren-Blackwood is through the Blackwood Youth Action Inc. The \$250,000 of funding for this project is driving a positive change in Warren Blackwood district in the towns of Bridgetown, Manjimup, Boyup Brook, Pemberton, Northcliffe, Greenbushes and Nannup.

The funding from the DAEP grants helps community organisations with the cost of things such as new vehicles and employing driving instructors.

Warren-Blackwood MLA Jane Kelsbie explains, "The funding boost million boost to the Driving Access and Equity Program is fantastic news for Warren-Blackwood. "This funding will make a real difference in the lives of those who face barriers in getting a driver's licence."

Obtaining a driver's licence is a key way of enhancing life outcomes for disadvantaged community members by improving access to things like employment, training and education. ...Continued on page 13

A highlight of the day for me was getting to announce Talison's partnership with Qube to trial a Bulk Electric Haulage Vehicle (**BEHV**) along the haulage route from Greenbushes to the Port of Bunbury. The trial reflects Talison's commitment to developing sustainable solutions within its transport supply chain. As the world's largest producer of lithium mineral concentrate, Talison has a key role to play in the global transition to cleaner energy. This trial aligns perfectly with one of Talison's core values of creating a better future and is another positive step forward in Talison's sustainability journey. The trial will feature a fully electric prime mover with a double trailing set, which, once in operation, will be the largest on-road electric truck combination in the world. The trial will determine the BEHV's viability on Talison's haulage route by evaluating:

- · truck range under load;

- economic feasibility; and
- community impact/benefits.

In the lead-up to the announcement, Talison and Qube hosted a sustainability-themed competition for students aged 12 and under from the Bunbury and Warren Blackwood regions. Students were asked to draw "What does a greener future look like to me?". The winning designs will be used as the trailer wrap for the truck. Congratulations to Willa (pictured), Mike, and Blayne for placing first, second, and third.

Backyard Buddies

Compost buddies:

a boost with springtails

Springtails are usually 1 to 3 mm and inhabit dark, moist environments so you might not have noticed them before. You're more likely to see them after heavy rains, but why not check your compost?

Ecological decomposers

Springtails are wondrous little creatures which can help speed up decomposition processes in our compost bins. There are many species across the world providing this great service. Springtails eat fungi, decaying plant and animal material and other waste products. This breaks those materials into smaller pieces that soil microbes like some bacteria and nematodes can convert into nutritious forms that plants can use, i.e. fertiliser! Because of this beneficial activity, they can also be used in terrariums and pet animal enclosures to consume undesirable mould and animal wastes.

Springtails are also a source of food themselves for beetles, flies and other insects. You may even spot



geckos, hanging around the rim of your compost bin looking for a feed.


Springing superpower

Like insects, springtails have three pairs of legs, a head, thorax and abdomen, but no wings. Despite their similarities they are not insects and belong to a different taxonomic group called Collembola. As their name suggests, most springtails... spring! Those that do, have a little tail like appendage called a furca on the underside of their abdomen. It's normally held in

place under high tension. If danger is detected, the furca can spring open to catapult the springtail up, up and away! It's been suggested this would be comparable to a human jumping higher than a six storey building. Amazing!

Compost buddy

Seeing springtails in compost is an indicator of a healthy compost ecosystem... Continued on page 15

This beautiful time of the year is always very busy in our town! As well as our gardens bursting with springtime colour, marathon visitors, music galore and the Agricultural show, many community groups had their AGM, as did we.

We are grateful to have an active committee, renewed and new members as we begin winding up our year and planning

Our Chairperson, Jim Ife, delivered a profound Chairperson's Report at the AGM and we quote some section of it here.

"The work of Transition Bridgetown, and indeed the entire Transition Towns movement, has arguably never been more important. We are faced with not just climate crisis but climate catastrophe, as political leaders of both mainstream parties, in Australia and elsewhere, ignore the serious consequences of climate change, and continue to do too little too late. The threat to biodiversity has become critical, with potential eco-system collapses and mass extinction, that will affect agriculture and food security. The poisoning of the environment with plastics and other pollutants is also a major threat for our future. The over-fishing of the oceans and the depletion of topsoil threaten starvation for millions. The global economy, and hence the Australian economy, is frighteningly unstable as it depends on continuing growth while we approach the ecological limits to growth on a finite

In the face of such challenges, it is easy to feel pessimistic and powerless, but the global Transition Towns movement was established in the belief that if there is to be a way forward to a peaceful and sustainable society for all, the impetus will only come from local community action, at the level of the town rather than the nation, and Transition Towns groups are achieving amazing things.

In the words of Margaret Mead [Anthropologist] "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed, citizens can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has." To join us, please email transitionbridgetown19@

Transition Bridgetown is one such group of thoughtful, committed citizens, trying to do our bit towards making the world a better place, through local community action. We can't do it all ourselves, but we hope that by bringing people and community groups together, to share ideas and commitments, we can help the wonderful Bridgetown community to transition to a future of greater sustainability, localisation, and social justice. 

Continued from page 2...The plates/bowls/mugs are scraped clean into a container for composting, then given a cold rinse to clean off food remnants, followed by a hot soapy wash, then a second rinse and finally a very hot sanitising rinse of 70+ degrees.

The water is rotated so that only the soapy hot wash and sanitising rinse water need to be replaced intermittently. The urn heats the water. A connection to electricity and water source is required.

Transition Bridgetown Inc has the relevant insurances for the Wash Against Waste Trailer to be utilised by community groups in the Bridgetown/Greenbushes shire and neighbouring towns and shires.

In order to cover the annual registration cost of approx \$100, annual insurance premiums of \$1200 [includes volunteer insurance] and on-going maintenance, there is a hire charge and bond associated with the use of the WAW trailer.

The agreed contract stipulates that the wash trailer must be picked up and returned by the agreed date unless otherwise arranged. It must be returned in a neat, orderly condition. A refundable bond of \$50 for a community event or \$100 for a private function is charged. Any breakages or incidents must be reported. A minimum donation of \$50+ per application to hire the wash trailer is required unless otherwise arranged. If volunteers are required to work on the WAW trailer at the event, then a further donation of an agreed amount will be included.

We are delighted to have the support of our Shire President Cr Jenny Mountford, whose comment we quote, "I commend Transition Bridgetown for this wonderful initiative not only for their own use, but now for the broader community. It would be wonderful to see the Wash Trailer used at all of our Bridgetown and Greenbushes events. This would not only help our local environment, but also spread a terrific message to those who visit us."

What's Inside Dalgarup?

For most of the past 15 years my knowledge about Dalgarup has been limited to file notes about the ten year fight by Bridgetown Greenbushes Friends of the Forest and Blackwood Environment Society to save it from intensive logging procedures planned to start in about 2000.

Dalgarup had not been included with National Parks to be reserved under the Regional Forest Agreement process. An outcry by those left out followed. Ecoscape Consultants were appointed by the Government to review 100 cases where local forests had not been included. The result was that only one of these was accepted – Dalgarup – and that was largely due to the level of support from the Bridgetown community.

With the end of native forest logging there was no need to concentrate on the areas south east of Bridgetown, So I started to find out what I could about Dalgarup.

I eventually found you could drive up Guy Road right through the Park but most other logging tracks appeared to be overgrown or blocked by fallen trees. To me the interior of Dalgarup seemed to be like Africa, "dark and mysterious."

Preparation for prescribed burning of Dalgarup included bulldozing of a trafficable firebreak from Wetherly Road between the Jarrah Park and the Nunn Block, along the line of the old Purslane Road. Nunn Road (leading from Brockman Highway to the north east of the Nunn Block) was cleared of thickets that had completely blocked it off. This meant that we now had vehicle access to the full width of the Jarrah Park and Nunn Block – until two large trees were blown down across each end of Purslane Road.

Aerial photos suggested that there may have been an old track in from the Brockman Highway to Purslane Road. Three of us set out yesterday expecting to find a largely overgrown road. Overgrown it

certainly was, but at the level of the forest canopy. The track turned out to be an old CALM road with steep banks across it instead of culverts. Fortunately my exhaust system is still there.

As we moved past the blue gum plot into Nunn Block the forest was magnificent, especially as we ran down into the Maranup Brook, which is the centre of the Jarrah Park Blackbutt Trail. Soon after, we approached the fallen tree from the east. It's a wonder it stayed standing at all, as its roots had almost completely rotted away.

WHERE TO NEXT?

BGFF is proposing to work towards a concept plan to prepare the way for Parks and Wildlife and their Joint Management Partners the Karri Karrack Corporation (representing the Pibulmen and Wadandi Communities) to undertake development of an outstanding forest National Park with Government funding.

Proposals for how BGFF members and interested members of the community can work towards this will be explored at the BGFF Sundowner to be held at 5 pm on Saturday week November 16.

Mining Exploration Claim - Latest

Four people from Bridgetown and one from the Donnelly Village Management attended a "mention" hearing at the Mining Warden's Court yesterday, to start the process of defending 32,000 Ha of forest against a mining exploration claim

A date for the first of possible hearings was to be set. Richard will report progress at the BGFF Sundowner on Saturday week 16 November.

Continued from page 8...If you notice that springtail numbers are decreasing, check there's adequate moisture and that your bin lid fits well. They cannot survive in dry environments for extended periods. Springtails will find their own way into compost from surrounding areas. Noticed new and damaging pests?
