Blackwood Marathon Relay.

In 1978, the WA Government of the day issued a challenge to organizations throughout the state to come up with novel ideas in which to celebrate WA's 150th year of colonial settlement during the following year.

Several members of the Bridgetown Rotary Club together with members of the public from Boyup Brook, took up the challenge by sketching a route taken from the air across some 56 km of hilly terrain basically following the Blackwood River



between the two towns. The resultant course became the foundation for the Blackwood Marathon Relay.

The resultant course became the foundation for the Blackwood Marathon Relay.

This unique relay event, utilising people with significant sporting skills across 5 different sport disciplines including running, canoeing, swimming, equestrian and cycling, required team members to effectively pass the "baton" between each leg with the result being that the first team across the line was declared the winner. Significant prizes ensued and commemorative medallions for each team successfully managing to finish the event were issued.

It maybe claimed to be a world first, and has been emulated in different forms by various organisations and various towns since that initial event. In 1979 it attracted 54 teams, 80 something in the second and 125 in the third reaching a climax of some 370 teams in the mid nineties. Today some 45 years later, we expect around 130 teams which include iron people and 4 member teams who are unable to fill the equestrian leg.

The event has been held every year except for the one cancelled during the COVID years and there has only been two changes to the route that I can recall since the inaugural race. The first occurred not long after it started. The cycle leg originally went through the main streets of Bridgetown with the finish at the Bridgetown Show Grounds. A train shunting on Steere Street halted proceedings in about the ... Continued on page 15

Biosecurity

Blackwood Biosecurity is a not-for-profit organisation. Its main function is to support landholders with the management of declared pests and weeds on their property.

"This year Blackwood Biosecurity visited 685 separate properties supporting landholders with their declared pest problems including blackberry, rabbits, feral pigs, foxes, bridal creeper, feral cats and cottonbush." Trish McCourt, Blackwood Biosecurity Executive Officer explains.

"Our service includes free equipment loans, weed spraying, baiting, trapping, biological and chemical controls, demonstrations, professional advice and permit applications. Also, we achieved 1,165 calicivirus, rabbit haemorrhagic disease virus releases and drops.

"The free equipment for loan includes: fox lights, fox traps, trail cameras, cat traps, rabbit traps, warren traps, pig traps, bait boxes, backpack sprayers, spray trailer and weed wipers.

"The team includes four paid and passionate staff: Trish McCourt, Executive Officer; Jason Dearle, Operations Manager; James Moyes, Operations Officer and Max Cornish, Admin, Communications and Events (ACE) Officer.

"We also have seven volunteer and inspirational committee members at this time: Gwendalyn Banks, Chair; Jenny Dewing, Vice Chair; Marg Morton, Secretary; Leigh Carroll, Treasurer; Julia Boyle, Mark Schneider and Stewart Kay all general committee members.

If you didn't make it to the "Night Calling" Open Space documentary on Owls, we can tell you that it was a very moving and informative Open Space! Transition Bridgetown and Bridgetown Landcare co-hosted the event and Dr Boyd Wykes and Mr Ian Wheeler presented their research and findings. The most crucial message that we took away from the session, is to be mindful of the type of rat and mice poisons that we use in our sheds and households.

Many of these poisons are readily available on the shelves of hardware stores in Australia but have been banned from use in other countries.

Some of the most common rat baits available are lethal to birds of prey and other wildlife through 'secondary poisoning' from their baited prey.

The preference is to use traps rather than baits to control rats and mice without harming wildlife. This enables release of any unintended wildlife captures.

Do use only the less harmful baits which contain the active ingredient coumatetraly [eg Racumin] or warfarin.

Do not use second generation anticoagulant rodenticides with difenacoum. brodifacoum. bromadiolone difethialone.

Finally, take great care with storing and placing baits so that pets and wildlife can't reach them.



You may know that BHS has been the recipient of a grant from the Native Forest Transition: Community Small Grants Fund (Round 2). This will enable BHS to establish a Bridgetown Orcharding Museum.

There is much renovating work to be done on the existing rear shed behind the Police Station Museum which will be the site of the Orcharding Museum. The completed shed will then be used to preserve and display the history of orcharding in Bridgetown. Much of the equipment, tools and gear used in packing sheds on home orchards and ultimately in the Paterson's Packing Shed have been in storage after their removal from the old Visitor Centre and will once again be displayed. 

"The students used coloured costumes to represent different groups and a central white coloured character to highlight inequities and bias.

"The blues wouldn't accept the white because he didn't look like them, the pinks didn't accept that he could do magic because 'you're not pink, you can't do magic', the multi-coloured group wouldn't accept him because he didn't rap like them, the reds don't accept him because they don't accept anyone who isn't red and angry.

"However, we see that people within the different coloured groups are struggling with the idea that they have to be a certain way, and we see that some characters claim to be accepting of anyone, but only if not everybody knows

"Through the creative use of short scenes and powerful character interactions, Bridgetown High School's Find Our Way urged the audience to look at our similarities and value our differences and human connectedness -

"After all, aren't we all part of the same group?

"Judges commented on the creativity of the piece and acknowledged the use of humour, fun, colour and movement, set alongside insightful and thoughtprovoking moments. They positively commented on the skills of the performers."
