St Brigid's Patchwork Tapestry

One of the little treasures that will be on show during the 120th year anniversary of St Brigid's Parish is the patchwork tapestry in St Brigid's Church; this tapestry has hung on the back wall of St Brigid's Church now for fifty-one years and has now been listed in Bridgetown-Greenbushes Art Trail Booklet.

Father Noel Fitzsimmons was the driving force behind the patchwork tapestry, his vision was it would be seven metres long and 1.5 metres high, the concept arising from a tapestry he delighted in when visiting a small church in England.

Father Noel had the paper patterns of the design which was to be used, and he had various bolts of different cloth and the idea to make the tapestry in sections, he was only lacking the knowledge and knowhow to complete his idea.

He asked Pamela Pratico to bring his idea to fruition by sewing, patchworking, appliqueing and quilting the sections into the tapestry.

In 1973 Tony and Pam Pratico were newlyweds living in a caravan in Wokalup. Tony was then working for the Department of Agricultural. Pam took on the task of completing each section and then stitching the tapestry together.

Father Noel would visit Pam once a week to see how the tapestry was progressing. Because of the small size of the caravan Pam and Tony were living in, he thought she would have more space in the convent and suggested the tapestry could be moved there to be completed.

Pam surprised everyone by completing the task in the caravan in three months. The completed tapestry, a rolled buddle of material was then placed on the floor of the ground floor passageway of the convent, the only place big enough to roll the tapestry out.

How to hang the tapestry was a dilemma and the next task. Pam, Sister Rose, the cook at the Convent and former parishioner and Myrtle Rose sewed loops along the top edge of the tapestry so it could be hung on a timber curtain rail on the back wall of the church.

The tapestry tells the story of the Bible, starting in the Garden of Eden and finishing with the Book of Revelations in the New Testament.

The tapestry hangs in the open and has certainly stood the test of time over the last fifty-one years remaining a colourful welcoming sight for all those who enter the church... Continued on page 13

Dangers of Complacency

Bridgetown Repertory Theatre's next production is H*tlers Tasters, a fictional retelling of a story of young German women conscripted to taste Adolf Hitler's food for poison in that anxious period towards the end of the war.

This play was put forward by Julia Robinson for consideration to be staged by the theatre. It's a play which has strong female roles, a play which Julia reasoned would be easy to produce, having only three cast members and only one stage setting.

Julia first came to the Repertory around twelve months ago when she appeared in the 'Women in Black' musical in the role of Patty, a play for which she was also the musical director. Julia has also been working backstage and was the stage manager for the Repertory production 'Bridgetown has

Those on the production committee were convinced of her abilities, and they informed Julia they would support her in producing the play. The outcome was unexpected, Julia found herself in the driving seat.

Julia now had a role as a debut director, "We have around ten weeks to stage this play and I have had a lot of wonderful support from the Repertory.

"Jude Sutherland is my wonderful stage manager; Ray Murphy is on sound and Riyana Diallo is doing the lighting. Sue Bottomly sourced the costumes from the extensive repertory wardrobe.

"The three cast members are Jorji Harper, Zoe Allington and Daisy Bygott.

"All three are first time actors with the Bridgetown Repertory and they are all on stage throughout the entire play. Community Investment Program

The Bridgetown Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade now has a new welfare vehicle thanks to a \$138,000 donation from Talison's Community Investment Program (CIP). The Ford Ranger 4WD, equipped with a purpose-built canopy, will provide essential amenities like tea, coffee, water and snacks at forward control points during emergencies.

It will also distribute meals to emergency volunteers and can tow the existing welfare trailer, expanding its reach during incidents.

I had the great pleasure of being provided a rundown of the vehicle by Bridgetown Volunteer Bushfire **Brigade** Captain Millie Nedelkovski who explained to me how the vehicle welfare has ability to provide both rapid response and support at a second location during incidents deployment of their existing welfare trailer.

I'm also proud to share an update on the significant contribution Talison has made to Bridgetown Primary School through the CIP. Talison recently provided \$141,742, to assist the school in enhancing their playground facilities for students of all ages. They have since purchased six (6) pieces of new play equipment, including a large play module specifically designed for children aged four to six years old. Additionally, the funding has helped purchase and install two (2) new water drinking fountains, a picnic table, seating and audio-visual equipment in the undercover assembly area. Recently I was provided a tour of the new facilities and was pleased to see how the improvements are benefiting students' physical, social and emotional wellbeing.

The four pillars of Talison's CIP are:

- Quality Education
- Sustainable Environments and Biodiversity Improvement
- Health and Wellbeing; and
- Vibrant & Sustaining communities.

Advocacy WA provides a range of advocacy services for people with disabilities living in the South West. Anyone with a disability can access this free and independent service. We are based out of our main office in Bunbury and visit Bridgetown every other month. However, if you need us to come more often we will – just let us know!

Advocacy WA advocates for social change and service improvement in areas including accommodation, employment and financial security, education and training, transport, and access to specialist health services. Here is an example of how we helped someone recently:

Susie, a mother of two children aged 15 and 18, has Motor Neuron Disease. The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) asked her to move into a group-style home and Susie asked Advocacy WA to help her appeal this decision and get Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) funding to continue to live independently. Due to the intervention of Advocacy WA, the NDIS revised their previous decision and Susie was found eligible to move into her own apartment.

Advocacy WA also delivers workshops to help people navigate the NDIS and Disability Support Pension (DSP) in Bridgetown – the next workshop is on Thursday 23 May. Contact us at community@advocacywa.org.au to find out more.

Transition Bridgetown

At the Blackwood Regen Fest held recently, a collaboration between Blackwood Events for the Earth groups, the community expressed support for Transition Bridgetown's initiative to start a Repair Cafe in Bridgetown!

Repair Cafés have become increasingly popular in regional communities. Most recently they have set up in Donnybrook and Manjimup. It's time we took this initiative in Bridgetown.

A Repair Café is not somewhere you just leave an item to be repaired. Rather it is a place where you can bring your old appliance/furniture/clothing/tool/luggage/computer (or whatever) and talk to someone who can see whether it is able to be repaired, and who can work with you to do that repair if possible. It is a way not only of making things last longer, but also of skilling ourselves in how to repair old things rather than discarding them and creating yet more waste.

If we were to have a Repair Cafe in Bridgetown, we would probably start operating once-a-month, in a convenient location.

We would need to recruit a range of volunteers with repair skills who would be prepared to offer their services on a monthly basis.

Transition Bridgetown is holding an 'Open Space' meeting to discuss this possibility. We have invited people from existing Repair Cafés to come and help us by sharing their experience.

Justice Of The Peace Signing Service

There will be a Justice of the Peace available to sign and witness documents every Wednesday and Friday (except public holidays) between 10:00 and 12:00 at the Bridgetown Community Resource Centre.

Please ensure you bring along photo ID such as a passport or driver's licence.

For urgent JP services outside the above hours search https://www.wa.gov.au/service/ justice/civil-law/find-justice-of-the-peaceyour-area

For statutory declarations, there are many people who can witness these documents – you don't need a JP. Go to https://www.wa.gov.au/system/files/2020-03/authorised-witnesses-for-statutory.pdf

Affidavits can only be taken (i.e. witnessed and sworn/affirmed) by a JP, a legal practitioner, public notary, registrar or clerk of the court, or any mining registrar appointed under the Mining Act 1978.

Certified documents – there is no legislation in WA stipulating who can certify a copy, however, it is usually done by a person who is legislated to witness a statutory declaration.

Please note for witnessing a signature on anything other than an affidavit or a stat dec, there is no edict that says it must be done by a JP (unless it is written onto the document you need to be witnessed).



Applications are still open for the Community Small Grants Fund.

The Rotary Tour of the Blackwood

On Saturday 9th March a very successful 7th Tour of the Blackwood ride was held. This year, the most ever, 311 riders took part in the event.

A very pleased Mike Fletcher, the tour chair explains to us how it all unfolded, "For this event to take place we have over 80 volunteers, traffic marshals, watering point volunteers and those that manage the entertainment in the River Park.

"There were also 15 motor scouts helping out with any punctures, mishaps or unforeseen incidents, and there is a team of medical responders following all the riders.

"This year for those brave enough, ice baths where donated to be used at the finish or, for those who preferred other techniques, we also had volunteer masseurs.

"This year the event was modified slightly, to have all the riders in the three stages coming together around the same time. The Full Tour, 134kms, started at 7am; the Half and Best 65kms started at 9am and the Not So Cosy started in Greenbushes at 10am, bringing 75% of the riders together in the finish at midday at the River Park, enabling the celebrations and awards to be handed out altogether.

"The Rotary Club is very pleased at how smoothly the event unfolded with few problems arising.

"The tour has become the biggest fund raiser for the Bridgetown Rotary Club with around \$70,000 being raised this year.

"This amount of money was boosted above registration fees obtained by the efforts of riders and their sponsors, with teenagers Hannah Khong and Tommey Warren making standout efforts and En Khong who was riding in his 6th tour, raising funds from a sausage sizzle at Bunnings.

"The Rotary Club feels the event has a lot of potential for growth, with the idea of having a new ride ridden on a gravel road section."

With the monies raised the Rotary Club is supporting Blackwood Youth Action (BYA) which is a local charity that supports young people in the Warren Blackwood region and surrounds.

"We still have four weeks to opening night and I feel at this stage the production is coming along nicely and my three cast members are now bringing the play to life." Julia explained.

people in Australia. In the Warren Blackwood region, young people with mental health problems have extremely limited access to services to support them.
