Balingup Small Farm Field Day

In Association with the Balingup Progress Assoc. Inc "Yes, it's on again" Save the date 12th April 2025

This year the theme is 'Back to Basics' and we are expecting between 5,000 and 7,000 visitors.

Guest speakers will talk on topics to the Field Day themes this includes: Indigenous Noongar Seasons (Zac Webb), Fire wise Gardens (Chris Fererria), organic growing, composting (COBWA), bee keeping, machinery displays, shearing and sheep dog demonstrations.

This year we will have an expanded kids Zone with craft activities and scarecrow competition. Free face painting, Lions train rides, climbing wall, sandpit with toys and the Old MacDonalds Petting Zoo all free on the day. Local bands preforming on the main stage and buskers around the grounds.

Also, there are many food stalls and winery displays with tastings. Visitors can experience the iconic town of Balingup with its café culture and unique local crafts. Check out the Scarecrows on the main street, the Village Green and the Birdwood Avenue of honour for local servicemen.

The BSFFD differs from most other agricultural shows or fairs in that it concentrates on the activities of small farms. There are sections on grass roots farming techniques, livestock suitable for small holdings, poultry, small scale farm machinery and equipment, horticulture, farming information, Landcare, Biosecurity, gourmet foods from local producers, local crafts and market stalls featuring predominantly local products.

The field day is self-sufficient and rarely asks for grants. In the last 31 years we have donated \$500,000 to community groups. The committee of BSFFD is run by unpaid volunteers.

We use local suppliers where possible and give back to our community. Entry is \$20 per adult, Free entry children under 12 years old, \$10 per youth 13 - 17 Carer with Companion Card Free, Pensioners/Seniors with card \$15

Kim and Marie Perrier Celebrate Four Years of Their Sculpture Garden at the Blackwood Art Trail

Kim and Marie Perrier mark the fourth year of their evolving sculpture garden at this year's Blackwood Art Trail with the launch of four significant new sculptures. Among them is 'Aqueous' a life-sized cast aluminium sculpture embodying the magical energy of water, which won the 2024 Rockingham Sculpture Exhibition 'People's Choice Award'. Also featured is 'Ascension', a striking 2.5-metre winged female figure rising from a fluid realm.

Kim's work is held in both State and National Gallery collections across Australia and has received numerous awards

This year's exhibition also showcases the remarkable bronze sculptures of Margaret Beechey Rothery. Now 95 years old, Margaret began sculpting at 91 and continues to produce world-class work. Her latest pieces include George, a fully harnessed Shire horse pulling a Rune Stone; a Spanish Blood, spirited black bull with attitude; and a dynamic bronze steer in motion. Margaret, a true Bridgetown legend, was featured on ABC News on Christmas Day 2024.

The Perrier Sculpture Garden now boasts forty works by this award-winning artist, set within an ever-expanding granite, garden, landscape passionately designed and nurtured by Marie Perrier.

To celebrate, a Sculpture, Wine & Song Night will be held on April

12th at 6 PM. Enjoy music from a local jam band featuring Kim, along with a guided tour where he will share insights about selected sculptures A \$10 entry fee includes a glass of wine or champagne and finger food.

Our Responsibility operating in your community

We recognise the privilege we have of operating in WA's South West and the responsibility that comes with it. While our current and planned mining activities create opportunities, such as increased employment, community investment, and local procurement, they also have negative impacts, particularly from clearing, dust, noise, and light. We are committed to where possible implementing measures that avoid, minimise, rehabilitate, and offset these impacts.

Community Feedback Process

We value your input, and while we haven't always, and won't always get it right, we will continue to learn and improve. We look forward to working together to ensure more open, transparent, and meaningful communication, particularly in relation to impacts such as dust, noise, and light.

We do recognise that as our operations grow, these impacts are becoming more noticeable. In response, we have expanded and will continue to strengthen our capacity to receive and address community feedback.

All community feedback received by our dedicated community team based on-site in Greenbushes is recorded and logged, helping us shape improvements and, where possible, adjust operations to mitigate impacts. Community Engagement Sessions on Capacity Expansion Projects

Thank you to everyone who took the time to attend one of the 10 community engagement sessions held recently in Bridgetown, Greenbushes, and Balingup on the proposal to expand the mine to the east and south to deliver new and expanded waste rock landforms, expanded water storage capacity, and supporting infrastructure. We appreciate it.

Being a residential mine with a workforce of more than 1,700, we aim to do the right thing by the communities we are part of. These are the towns our workforce calls home and they've been with us through the ups and downs. During the sessions, it was made abundantly clear that we have more work to do to be a better neighbour. Areas for improvement include more transparent communications, managing our impacts more effectively, and responding to your enquiries more promptly, with a greater focus on addressing and resolving your questions and concerns. We heard your strong feedback regarding dust emissions from our operations and will soon share actual compositional information of our dust and a fact sheet that will help you to interpret this information. Additionally, we will create a dedicated section on our website with more accessible dust information and up to date data. As we go, we will seek your feedback on whether this information is helpful, or if there is anything else we can provide.

All the feedback received from this and future consultation on project impacts and potential mitigation strategies will be collated and where appropriate, responded to. This information will be available on our website and discussed at future engagement sessions and included in the environmental assessment documentation. 2024 Economic Contributions

During the community engagement sessions, it also became apparent that we need to better share the ways Talison contributes to the local economy, state and federal governments, and its grassroots community investment. In 2024, Talison contributed over \$853.4 million to local, state, and federal governments in Australia through taxes and royalties, and invested more than \$7 million in community projects across the South West region. Going forward, we will highlight the projects supported by Talison and how they are making a difference in the community.

Talison's Social Investment Programs

Through our social investment programs, we aim to make a positive impact on the social and economic outcomes of the surrounding communities. Our Community Support Program (CSP) funds projects that focus on health and wellbeing, education, arts and culture, community participation, and environmental sustainability. Through cash and in-kind donations, we support groups and organisations across the Shires of Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Donnybrook Balingup, Nannup, Boyup Brook, and Manjimup.

For larger, long-term projects, our Community Investment Program (CIP) provides funding to incorporated community organisations and local governments that align with regional needs. The four pillars of Talison's CIP are Quality Education, Sustainable Environments and Biodiversity Improvement, Health and Wellbeing, and Vibrant and Sustaining communities.

Water Management

Summer might be over, but it is still warm and water security remains front and centre of so many of our minds. For those who aren't aware, the water we use for our mining and ore processing comes from rainwater collected in onsite dams. With declining rainfall, our dams collect less water. Potable water for drinking and ablutions for our people, both onsite and at our accommodation facilities, is supplied by the Water Corporation from the Warren Blackwood Water Scheme.

As we expand, we will use more water. We are implementing measures to recycle more water and use less. We also plan to increase the capacity of our dams to better retain rainfall that falls on the mine site. Please note that some of these dam capacity expansion projects are already approved and underway. However, others, such as the expansion of the Southampton and Austin Dams, as well as the consolidation of five existing dams on Lyons Creek into a single larger Salt Water Gully Dam on Talison owned land, are still subject to assessment and approval from State and Federal regulators.

We implement a water management plan to manage potential impacts on surface and groundwater, which includes strict environmental quality standards and a "no discharge" policy. Our focus is on avoiding impacts on water downstream of the mine site and maintaining water quality, such as by recycling process water through our award-winning water treatment plant.

Annual Dust Presentation

Each year, Talison provides an annual update to the Greenbushes community on dust levels and composition, discussing our ongoing efforts to better manage and communicate on this impact. We will also be sharing our annual blast report, which details our blasting activities and provides an opportunity for the community to ask us questions about any of the impacts we have in this space.

This free event is organised by Grow Greenbushes, a community group working hard to enhance livability and ensure Greenbushes remains a good place to live. You do not need to be a member to attend; everyone is welcome at the meeting.

2025 Tour of the Blackwood

Now in its ninth year the cycling event 'Tour of the Blackwood' this year attracted 468 cycling enthusiasts to take part in the tour, making it a very successful event.

The tour caters for all levels of differing riding skills

an ability offering four sections to ride in.

The Full Tour took advanced riders along a 134 km trek and had 207 competitors, The Half 'n' Best is a 65 km ride and attracted 134 competitors, the Not so Cosy ride was a 35km ride and attracted 30 competitors.

This year a new ride along gravel tracks was introduced, the Numbat Experience, it successfully attracted 97 competitors.

The riders are taken along a series of routes which has them travelling through some of the most picturesque hills and valleys this region has to offer as it follows the Blackwood River to the south, east and west of Bridgetown.

Colin Booth was this year's tour director and explains how the event unfolded: "The members of the Rotary Club of Bridgetown, along with all those volunteers that are needed, the Marshalls and drink providers, the emergency medical teams and 'Moto Scouts' escorts and those who offer direction and refreshment or assistance in the event of breakdown or medical issue all contribute to make this event successful.

"There was a major incident this year when a back wheel on a competitor's bike came loose, bucking the rider off his bike. Our planned responses worked well with the following ambulance offering medical assistance quickly.

"The feed back from those who took part in the event was overwhelmingly positive, which is something the Rotary Club of Bridgetown is very proud of and sets a measure for next year's tour.

"The monies we raised this year from registrations and donations was over \$70,000.

The money raised is to be spent on Mental Health projects. The major beneficiaries are the Blackwood Youth Association along with the Bridgetown-Greenbushes Suicide Prevention Network, with other mental health initiatives we conduct throughout the year in conjunction with the local high schools, such as the successful showing of the film 'Just a Farmer'.

"The major sponsors of the Tour of the Blackwood are Wesfarmers and Talison Lithium."

Colin concludes, "Our thanks go out to the hundreds of volunteers and to the local police and those who contributed to making the Tour of Blackwood a wonderful as well as a successful day."

You will no doubt have heard about the fight to save the Greater Dalgarup Forest from mining. You may ask what makes this particular Forest so special?

This is why. The greater Dalgarup (about 4000 hectares), lies a short drive to the west of Bridgetown. This unique high conservation forest is a mix of iconic species; the most northerly occurrence of Karri, magnificent stands of old Blackbutts and some of the finest remaining Jarrah-Marri forest in the south west.

The forest is traversed by the world renowned Bibbulman walking track, and has a suite of rare and endangered plants and animals, including all three species of cockatoos, ringtailed possum and a notable population of mainland quokka. It includes the popular picnic and walking areas of the Bridgetown Jarrah Park and Karri Gully.

Our community of Bridgetown — Greenbushes has a long and strong attachment to this Dalgarup forest. We have worked since the 1980's to have the forest recognised for its high conservation value and to protect it from logging.

We'd love you to join us (Transition Bridgetown), Bridgetown – Greenbushes Friends of the Forest and Blackwood Environment Society to learn about this very special forest at an Open Space to be held at the Uniting Church Hall on Sunday 27th April 4pm-6pm. Hear the history of community efforts to protect and conserve the Greater Dalgarup, see videos of the area and fauna under threat, ask your questions to find out how you can help us save this forest from mining. Regen Fest throws a spotlight on sustainability

This year's event at the Ashbil Community Garden on Saturday 22nd of March brought together twenty five stalls covering everything from electric vehicles to permaculture, and combined them with a lot of practical informative talks on sustainability.

Charles Otway from Terra Firma Design spoke on natural fertilisers and their contribution to soil fertility.

He pointed out that, "he wasn't just talking crap," and that nitrogen fixing plants play an important role as well,"

David Chick and Keita Burrell's talk on 'Get to know your bioregion' combined an understanding of the importance of the natural environment with a regional capacity for food production. What's missing from local produce, and what alternatives exist, were just some of the questions that they raised.

But they'd also like to record local people with food to spare from their own back yards.

It's a vision of a comprehensive index of local food resources put together by volunteers, and it was just one of the talks full of nitty-gritty details in the quest for regional sustainability.

Other speakers covered everything from chickens, to honey bees, waste reduction and drought resilience.

Bridgetown and Greenbushes people came out in big numbers for the event that was put together by Transition Bridgetown, the Ashbil and Greenbushes Community Gardens, Postcode Permaculture 6255, and the Bridgetown Hub. The planning committee was ably led by Mike and Jo Kaye.

"I think a lot of people in this community do have a commitment to sustainability," said Jim Ife, president of Transition Bridgetown.

"There's a lot of people who aren't quite sure of how to go about achieving that as much as they'd like to.

"But I think that in Bridgetown there are lots of people who want to do proper recycling and environmentally friendly things, and who don't want to be part of poisoning the earth," he said.

It was good to see the increasing interest each year in the Regen Fest, he added.
