Jaden recently gained first place in the Open Piano Solo section and Best original composition.at the Prestigious Bunbury Eisteddfod. The Dale family ensemble will be playing Baroque and Klezmer music. We are also priviledged to have local music teacher and musician Cecilia Karafilis performing a flute solo and vocal duet with Guy Wardell Johnson.

The two young multi award winning pianists (Kinderspiel) who gave a thrilling perfomance at Up Close and Classical in 2022 will be returning to play for us after a very successful tour of South East Asia and the super talented family ensemble (the O'Wallace family) will be performing again.

Joan

It is with sadness that I announce the passing of Joan Krauze. She died on Tuesday 20th August after a brief illness.

Joan was admitted through the emergency department of the Bunbury Regional Hospital after attending the Bridgetown Regional Hospital late one night feeling unwell and confused.

After X-rays, scans and a lot of assorted tests she was diagnosed mainly with pneumonia. Her health deteriorated very rapidly over her twelve day stay in hospital and she passed away peacefully.

As my wife and my business partner Joan had an integral role in the running of The Quality Shop and in the production of The Mailbag.

Joan and I, Michael Krauze, bought our little patch of Bridgetown in the early part of the 1970s. Bridgetown was then suffering economically from Great Britain becoming a member of the European Common Market, thus removing the lucrative income Bridgetown derived from the growing and exporting of a variety of apples and pears to England; this change more than halved the district's population. The various packing sheds, five empty bank buildings, two car dealerships and farm machinery dealership buildings, which are all around town, that have now been repurposed, remain as reminder of a time that once was.

The land we purchased was an old mixed orchard, apples, pears, peaches, apricots, cherries and plums all of which Joan found to be a delightful wonderland.

We moved onto our land firstly in a tent while we fixed up an old packing shed turning it into a place we could live in, with a kitchen, a Metters No1 stove in the middle, a bedroom, a bed in the corner, and long drop toilet out in the dark cold freezing night air. We used the town swimming pool showers to wash until we had a water meter and stand pipe put onto our block that enabled us to hose ourselves down with water under the lemon tree.

Our neighbour Martha was a godsend, she was always welcoming, always cooking pumpkin scones and always giving us her overflow of food from her vegie garden and fruit trees.

And so it began, yes, it was good start to our new life in



Bridgetown into which Joan become part of the community through the various clubs and interests; Bridgetown Tourist Centre, Bridgetown Art and Craft Centre, Blackwood Artist Guild, Blackwood Writers Group, the Bridgetown Repertory Club and as a supporter of many other sporting clubs with raffle prizes and trophy prizes.

The Agricultural Show for Joan was a 'must enter' event because it showcased the many and varied farming abilities and differing talents of those living in the district.

As was the way of life in a rural town back then, we were self-employed, and made our living through a main street business, which culminated with operating The Quality Shop.

Over the many years of running a business in the main street, lots of the folks have come to know Joan well. I am reminded by friends and customers of Joan's welcoming nature and of her many acts of kindness. She would always welcome a stranger.

A service is to be held for Joan at the William Barrett and Sons Funeral Home, which is on Spencer Street in Bunbury on Thursday the 12th of September starting at 11am.

Joan has written a lot of poetry. She was born in Kalgoorlie, one of four daughters, into a time when life was a lot poorer and tougher in Australia than the life we enjoy today; I will share the one below with you:

Walk proud, the women who made Australia Our pioneering roots run strong and deep We're fighters, strugglers, never giving in, If there's a job to do, we're always game. I'm as my sisters, my mother, my grandmother, always ready to lend a hand, We are pioneering stock,

We never stop to question why or how. If there's a job to be done, we plunge right in, that's what a woman is all about.

Bridgetown High School's Copernicus Club

Despite its small size, Bridgetown High School has developed one of the state's most unique and dynamic academic extension societies. Centred around Humanities and Social Sciences, the members of the Copernicus Club - as the school-invented program is called - have won over 100 national merit awards or equivalent since Copernicus was founded in 2021. This includes having a state champion in the Australian History Competition, beating older senior school students from neighbouring senior high schools in a regional business competition, and placing a student on the highly competitive Western Australian Student Council.

The Copernicus Club is organised around the guiding principle that if students enjoy what they are doing, then they will learn more and will push themselves harder. All activities are shaped around substantial student voice and input, and are typically free of cost for students to partake in. Uniquely, Copernicus encourages a social element, and for students to heavily involve their friends in their projects. The Club strives for academic extension to be a social event as well as an academic one.

Aside from participating in national and regional competitions, students take on numerous creative projects such as designing their own chocolate line based on realworld sales statistics and having it taste-tested, "Bake Off" style, in front of a panel of older judges; analysing spatial distributions of old 1800s Gold Rush towns and then generating a new "town plan" based on those patterns, which they then had to construct out of thousands of Legos; designing a new superhero cartoon franchise and merchandise products based on "market research" conducted on younger students; organising an annual endof-year formal dinner based around a historical theme and period dress; and creating Jurassic Park-style exhibits of huge ancient Australian megafauna. Students also, as a group, initiate and design HaSS-themed excursions based on topics studied in class, such as to a chocolate factory near Yallingup to study start-up business design and theme parks near Busselton to study the interaction and impacts between tourism and the natural environment.

To qualify for membership in the Copernicus Club, a student needs to receive an A-grade in Humanities and Social Sciences on their final report, or a B-grade in Humanities and Social Sciences plus A-grades in two of either Mathematics, English or Science. Though accepting an invitation is voluntary, uptake is around 95%, and membership in the Club has doubled since inception and now stands at 33 members.

Greenbushes Lithium Operation Becomes First Australian Mine to Commit to IRMA Independent Audit

Talison Lithium Pty Ltd (**Talison**) recently announced that its Greenbushes Lithium Operation (Mine, Site) will be the first mine in Australia to undergo a third-party independent assessment against the Initiative for Responsible Mining Assurance (**IRMA**) Standard for Responsible Mining. The decision to volunteer the Mine for IRMA audit reflects Talison's commitment to responsible mining practices and transparency.

The IRMA assessment will be conducted by SCS Global Services (SCS), an IRMA-approved independent audit firm, and will include a comprehensive two-stage process: a desktop review (Stage 1) followed by an onsite audit (Stage 2). Below is an extract from the announcement.

"We care about a better future—and we know our stakeholders do as well. Whether it be employees, the community, or customers, we want them to know we are committed to responsible mining and production practices" said Talison's Interim Managing Director, Ian McGuire.

"To achieve this, we need to provide those affected by our Mine with the information they need to engage in meaningful dialogue about where Talison is achieving high standards, and where there is more work to be done. That's why we're conducting an IRMA audit".

"By volunteering the Mine for an independent audit against the world's most rigorous global mining standard, Talison is providing unprecedented transparency into the operations of an Australian mine" said IRMA Executive Director Aimee Boulanger.

"They are effectively putting themselves under a microscope and welcoming affected stakeholders to examine their operations and help them make their operations more responsible".

IRMA is:

- 1) a voluntary mining standard describing best practices to protect people and the environment;
- 2) an assurance process to measure mines against that standard; and
- 3) an organisation equally governed by representatives of six (6) affected stakeholder sectors communities, organised labour, Non-Government Organisations (NGOs), finance, purchasers and mining companies that controls the standard and the assurance process.

Annual Science Fair at Greenbushes Primary School

It was great to see Talison return to Greenbushes Primary School for their annual science fair last month! A big thank you to the Talison team members who volunteered their time to present the science behind their work in an engaging and accessible way for the students. Activities included launching canister rockets, observing the effects of liquid nitrogen on marshmallows, creating a battery from a lemon, a relay with stations focused on conservation and fauna, photo booth, magnetic separation, screening/sieving and a pH indicator experiment. What to do with Bridgetown's Waste!

On Sunday 25th August Transition Bridgetown, in collaboration with Bridgetown Greenbushes shire, hosted an Open Space on "Waste" at the Uniting Church Hall. It was well attended and provided valuable information on different aspects of managing our Waste as well as encouraging use of the waste management hierarchy - Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repurpose, Recycle.

Shire President Cr Jenny Mountford, outlined the shire's current position at the Bridgetown Waste Facility which is further outlined below. The conditions of a possible Repair

Cafe and Tip Shop were mentioned.

Iggy Van spoke about his business, Purple Plough, taking over the Containers for Change Program. He explained the new system for the collection of containers that he has implemented and what items are accepted.

Candice Myers from Cleanaway, outlined how comingled recyclables are processed and shared information about contamination of items in our recycling bins.

The presentations were followed up with displays by local residents who reuse and repurpose items like clothing, books, textiles, timber, furniture, garden tools. Other passionate recyclers in our community were present to share their experiences of collecting and appropriately distributing recyclable materials such as mobile phones, blister packs, toothcare products, writing implements, reading glasses, plastic bread tags, CD's, hair products, razor blades, batteries, stamps and plastic plant labels. E-waste is another category where local collectors recover metals to be repurposed. There was also information on the use of the Wash Against Waste trailer for community events to reduce the amount of disposable plates, cups and cutlery going to landfill.

The Bridgetown waste site has a total area of 27.7 hectares. Landfilling on site has been a mixture of above

and below ground cells. The Shire is still utilising the current Cell 1, 5 years beyond expectation and the projected operational life of this cell is between January 2026 – May 2027.

The presentations were followed up with displays by local residents who reuse and repurpose items like clothing, books, textiles, timber, furniture, garden tools. Other passionate recyclers in our community were present to share their experiences of collecting and appropriately distributing recyclable materials such as mobile phones,

Cr Jenny Mountford spoke about the Shire of Bridgetown - Greenbushes Strategic Community Plan 2021-2031 saying that it includes working towards 'A sustainable, low waste, circular economy'. The listed objectives to achieve the outcome include:

 Provide sustainable, cost-effective waste management infrastructure and services AND
 Encourage the adoption of sustainable waste behaviours through waste education and communications.

CELEBRATING COMMUNITY

Minister Michael Visits Talison

I had the pleasure of hosting Minister David Michael, who oversees Mines and Petroleum, Ports, Road Safety, during his visit to our electorate. He joined me on a tour of Talison Lithium's Greenbushes site.

The Greenbushes mine is a major player in the global lithium market, with the capacity to meet a third of the world's demand for lithium spodumene concentrate, a crucial component in lithium-ion batteries. Projects like Talison's are vital for our state's role in the global energy transition and support our economy's shift towards renewables.

We are also partnering with Talison on a \$6.6 million feasibility study to explore the recommissioning of the Greenbushes to Bunbury Railway Line. Currently, there are 135 truck movements per day, potentially rising to 200, amounting to 70,000 truck movements annually. By shifting these road movements to rail, we aim to improve road safety for the community.



Mitigation Activity Fund (MAF)

The Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes was recently awarded \$12,983 to undertake preventative measures to reduce bushfire risk. The latest funding provided through the MAF is in addition to the extra \$140 million committed by the Cook Government to better equip first responders.



Growing On Facility

It was fantastic to officially open the BES Blackwood Environment Society's new 'Growing On' facility, where the community can now purchase native plants directly from their newly established nursery.

Thanks to a \$38,835 grant from the Native Forest Transition Community Small Grant program, this passionate and dedicated team can now offer affordable native plants that will significantly boost landcare efforts in the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes. These plants will be vital for habitat restoration, providing crucial forage and shelter for local wildlife.

The grant also facilitated the group's accreditation with the National Nursery Industry Accreditation Scheme Australia. Additionally, it funded five workshops to upskill volunteers in seed collection, cuttings preparation, and nursery hygiene, and supported two school-based horticulture trainees with hands-on experience.

The morning tea following the opening was a great opportunity to connect with the amazing local volunteers and supporters!





Rotator cuff tendon degeneration and strains

The rotator cuff is a band of thick fibrous tissue that wraps around the shoulder, like a shirt cuff wraps around your wrist and forearm. It is made up of four tendons, the tough structures at the ends of muscles that attach them to a bone. The rotator cuff muscles arise from the front, top and back of the shoulder blade and their tendons attach on the front and top of the arm. When the muscles contract they lift the arm to the side and then up or rotate the arm inwards or outwards, depending on the muscle.

Any of the rotator cuff tendons can develop issues but most of the time the problem is with the tendon of the supraspinatus muscle, the one on the top of the shoulder that moves the arm to the side. This tendon passes through a small tunnel formed by a ligament and three bones at the end of the shoulder. Problems occur if the tunnel becomes narrower, and the tendon is pinched as the arm is lifted to the side. Osteoarthritis in one of the shoulder joints can reduce the space in the tunnel by changing the shape of the bone but this is rare. More often the tunnel becomes narrower because of poor posture, especially the classic round shoulders posture.

Extreme force can cause a normal healthy tendon to tear, but the problem is usually the result of years of wear on the tendon and it fails from a relatively light load.

Genetics plays a small role in causing rotator cuff problems, because our genes determine the shape of our body, including the curvature of our spine, so if you have a very rounded thoracic spine you will tend to be more round shouldered.

A sedentary lifestyle is the main factor in causing rotator cuff problems because inactivity causes muscles and tendons to atrophy or waste away, and this makes them weaker and more vulnerable to injury. Activities like mobile phone use, affects posture by placing the arm in an internally rotated position, which closes the space in the tunnel for the tendon to glide.

Over months or years, inactivity and poor posture change the tone, strength and elasticity of shoulder muscles and the relative position of the bones around the shoulder, forcing the rotator cuff tendon to navigate a narrower tunnel, and mechanical wear leads to degeneration of the tendon

The degeneration can be mild, resulting in inflammation or swelling of the tendon, moderate, resulting in fibrous changes and thickening of the tendon or severe, resulting in calcification of the tendon. All of these result in loss of structural integrity of the tendon and greater vulnerable to injury.

Bursitis is one of the first features of degeneration. A bursa is a small fat pad that sits next to the tendon to help reduce friction during movement. But when the tendon becomes thicker it triggers a swelling in the bursa, which is bursitis. At this point, there may be stiffness in the shoulder and a mild ache when you lay on your side in bed at night, and the problem may eventually go away. If, however, the degeneration is allowed to progress or the tendon is torn or strained, then it will need treatment or an effective regime of self-help.

Rotator cuff strains range from a minor tear with a mild ache and stiffness, partial tear or full thickness tear with pain, catching and restricted movement, to a complete tear with the inability to lift the arm sideways.

A rotator cuff tendon can be torn by a strong force such falling on an outstretched arm or from an awkward movement such as when your arm is forced to change direction and you not expecting it. But more commonly it is the result of an innocuous action such as holding an object above your head or away from your body or there may be no recollection of an injury. The type of treatment for a rotator cuff tendon problem will depend on the level of degeneration, ...Continued page 15

Continued from page 14...whether it is torn and how badly it is torn. A rotator cuff tendon with significant degeneration, large full thickness tear or complete tear will require surgery. A bursitis with a minor or partial tendon tear will require ice packs, manual therapy and exercises. The affected structures of the shoulder, neck, upper ribs and thoracic spine will need cross-fibre kneading, passive stretching, transverse friction and mobilisation. Weak muscles will need strengthening and short muscles lengthening. Scar tissues will need to be removed from the affected area and the tendon rebuilt with a regime of isometric strengthening exercises.
