#### Fantastic Mr Fox

The Bridgetown Repertory's end of year shows this year will be 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. This production is based on the book by beloved children's author Roald Dahl and adapted for the stage by David Wood.

The stage play will be co-directed by a mother and daughter team, Emma McGuire along with her daughter Ella.

Emma gives us some insight in to how the production is unfolding, "There is a cast of thirty-six, the cast is made up of twenty children aged over eight years with four teenagers and twelve adults.

"Some of the young ones cast in the play have come up through the ranks in Kids Acting on Stage (KAOS) and Bridgetown Youth Theatre (BYT) repertory theatre programs.

"They are a wonderful group. We have divided the young actors into mentored groups with adult actors. This has provided them with an opportunity to workshop their parts in the show, coming back with thoughtful and creative input into their roles.

"We have also brought together some talented creative people to assist with the production, Shirley Hassen is handling the costumes, Caroline Morling is the Music Director and musician Jeff Sheahan has composed four songs especially for the play. Robert Benson-Perry has designed the set, which will be on a split level to create an above ground scene and an underground setting for the animals.

"Artist Emily Smith is painting the Woodland scene backdrop and we have Abi O'Wallace, who is fourteen, designing the illustration for the poster.

"Mrs Fox is being played by newcomer Erica Caldwell with Mr Fox being played by Anthony Flemming.

Emma continues, "This is my daughter's and my first time directing at the Repertory. We have had only six weeks of rehearsal time to have everything to come together, but so far, we are on track and hope it will be a memorable play.

"At the heart of the play is the journey of Mr Fox and his family. It is written as allegory, exploring the moral issue of stealing and the effects it has on oneself and others. ## The Old Shed Exhibition in Balingup

The current exhibition in the Shed is the Italian Contribution to the Establishment of Balingup in the years 1865 through to 1962. It shows us a little of the life journey taken by Italian families leaving their homeland during the time before the first World War, through the depression years then after the second World War to build a better life for themselves in the South West of Western Australia and here in Balingup and Mullalyup.

Many who arrived to make a new life in Australia were married, and had to leave behind their parents, wives and young children (to make a new life in Australia,) in the hope their families would eventually be able to join them in a country which offered far better opportunities.

Their stories are all varied, some were sponsored by earlier arrivals and had somewhere to go, others made their own way. On arrival at Fremantle some went on to learn a trade or worked in the timber industry, in particular cutting sleepers for the railway and mining industries. Others worked in

orchards, all those who worked here were always sending money back to support their families in Italy.

These hard-working migrants were separated from their loved ones for long periods, some for seven years, sometimes ten years.

Many of the Italian migrants went on to eventually own their own farms and then were able to pay the passage for their loved ones so they could be reunited as a family.

When the families did arrive, there were many difficulties to overcome such as language, isolation, and culture, particularly for the wives.

Their new life in Australia could not have been any more austere. Below is a passage from one of their stories which tells the tale of an Italian migrant Vittorio from Messina in Italy who arrived in the south west in 1928. He is famously remembered for having a 'never giving up' attitude, a resilience which was needed to be successful in forging a new life in a developing country.

Vittorio had lived and worked in the south west for eight years, during that time he saved enough money to buy a property, on which he grew vegetables and then was able to sell them at his shop in Balingup, having finally saved enough money to bring his family out to Australia to join him. #### **Bridgetown Historical Society**

"Sharing our stories"

One of the most-asked questions from school group visits to the Police Station Museum is 'has anyone escaped from the lock up'.

Well, the answer is yes – The Bunbury Herald and Blackwood Express in 1928 reported a break out:

THREE CHARGES AGAINST BRIDGETOWN LABOURER

"In the Bridgetown Police Court on Monday morning last before Messrs A. E. Bartlett and H. Lake, JsP. James Wilson, a married man with four children, working at Pemberton on the erection of cottages, was charged with having at Bridgetown on June 4, been disorderly by making use of obscene language in Steere Street: that on the same date assaulted Const. Styants in the execution of his duty. He was further charged with having on the same day escaped from legal custody to wit, from the Bridgetown lock-up and was thereby deemed to be an incorrigible rogue.

The charges were laid by Const. Styants. Const. Styants stated that at 3.45 he went to the cell, and the accused was then there, but when he again visited the cell at about 5pm Wilson had made his getaway, by removing the wooden lining of the cell near the window, working out a number of bricks from the wall, thus making a small opening through which he escaped. He was arrested in the evening when endeavouring to board the train to Manjimup and was again lodged in the lock up. This time he was handcuffed for safe keeping."

In 1936 the newspaper West Australian posted the account of a 13-year-old boy who had found his way down to Bridgetown, possibly by hiding on the train. In Perth he had been involved in, and charged with, a series of breaking into houses, stealing and giving false names. He was obviously homeless and without family support.

In Bridgetown he was arrested and placed in a cell. He lifted the floor boards and hid underneath. The police, thinking he had escaped, left the door open and he fled the Police Station. He was recaptured and sent back to Perth where hopefully he was able to receive help and care.

A visit to the Police Station Museum will reveal the cell where these escapes took place. The Museum is open on Wednesday and Friday from 9am to 3pm and Saturday from 10am to 1pm.

The Historical Society welcomes new members to help keep the stories of our town alive and responsive to our Heritage status.



#### The Bell Ringers

Corinne Rule and Adam Beer moved to Bridgetown around a year ago, the couple are experienced bell ringers. At different times they both have been in charge of ringing the bells in the Bell Tower in Perth. They are the owners of The Alphabet Ring bell setup which is housed in their shed on Roe Street.

The Alphabet Ring is a musical instrument like no other you will have seen. It is known as a mini-ring and consists of 8 bells tuned in a diatonic major scale of E flat.

The bells are rung using a rope and wheel. This is a small version of the church bells you would hear ringing for special occasions.

Most bells hung in this way are usually hung in church towers. There are also 'civic towers', such as the Bell Tower in Perth and the Civic Centre in Rockingham. Bells sets typically range from 5 to 12 bells.


The Bell Tower in Perth is unusual in being one of only three sets of bells in the world which have 16 bells in a musical scale.



The Alphabet Ring is the first privately-owned miniring in Australia, and indeed in the southern hemisphere. The bells were cast in the UK and exported to Australia in 2015 along with the wheels and bearings that enable them to be rung. The bell ropes were donated. Adam designed and built the frame housing the bells whilst they were living in New South Wales. There are 8 bells in the Alphabet Ring, the heaviest of which weighs just over

Corinne and Adam moved from Kalgoorlie to Bridgetown because they wanted to live rurally and they also wanted somewhere to live that was close enough to Perth to ring on the bells with their friends at St. George's Cathedral and Christ Church in Claremont.

Adam learnt the skill of ringing bells at the All Saint's Church in Tuckingmill, a village named for its fulling mill (used to treat woollen cloth), in Cornwall England. Bell ringing was so much part of his life that before he left England to come and settle in Australia, he made sure there was a bell ring fraternity here. There is, it's the Australia and New Zealand Association of Bellringers (ANZAB). Continued page 11

#### The Bell Ringers continued from page 9

Adam talks enthusiastically about bell ringing, "The Alphabet Ring is a miniature version of bells hung for fullcircle ringing, after the English fashion.

"Hanging bells in this way allows full control over when the bells strike, allowing for patterns or 'methods' to be rung. Tunes in the normal musical sense are not rung.

"The bells ring in sequence, but that sequence changes each time the bells are rung. The objective is to ring sequences which do not repeat in a given performance, which, depending on the length, may be called a 'touch', 'quarter peal' or 'peal'.

"Each bell (rope) needs a bellringer who knows what they are doing and so to be able to demonstrate this properly we would need either 6 or 8 trained bellringers.

When the bell ringing commences, we start with a descending scale, then we adjust our time, rhythm and speed to the 'method' we are using. Bell ringers have different ways of learning the sequences: after years of practice some can visualise the 'method', some use mnemonics as a way to remember.

"Recently we had bellringing friends visiting from Perth. On that weekend, the bell ringers took part in a ring of two previously un-rung 'methods' using half-muffled bells, in recognition of the passing of Queen Elizabeth II and the accession of the new King.

"Bell ringing for me is a passion, the larger the bell the more finesse is required. I have rung a bell which weighs around four tons, this come with its own danger: to ring a heavy bell you must stand on a box; if your stand on the ground the coiling and uncoiling of the rope around your feet can tangle around your legs hoisting you upside down into the air, leaving you bobbing up and down, which isn't a pretty sight."

Bell ringing, how hard could it be? As it turns out, it is not as easy as it looks. You pull the rope down until the bell is upside down and you hold it there, then on your turn, you pull the rope down, you let go of the rope, the bell strikes then when the rope reaches a point when the rope stops rising you hold the rope on the balance of the upside-down bell. The bell should only ring when it's upside down and only strike the once on each pull, or so it should - only after months to years of practice.

In 1936 Vittorio's wife Maria and son Napolini, who was eight years old and the young son Vittorio had not yet seen, arrived in Fremantle on board the ship 'Esquilino'.

Vittorio had not received the letter informing him of their arrival times and was not there to greet them on their arrival. Mail to Italy took six weeks. Eventually though, he was able to reunite with them after they travelled by train to Balingup

On arrival at the property Maria was very disappointed with the house which was not very appealing. It consisted of four small rooms and was made from jarrah face cuts, it had a dirt floor in the kitchen, unlined weatherboards on the walls and railway sleepers for flooring with three very small windows that did not open. A very sad depressing situation to be greeted with, after travelling half way around the world.

As time went by Maria began to adapt to life and improved their house, using bags for curtains and for insulating the walls. Cleaning was almost impossible, with no running water, only a tub which was used as a bath with the washing up done in a dish. She had a very old wood stove which had holes in its oven. She even made her own soan

Both Maria and young Napolini worked hard on the land and helped in the garden while Vittorio made deliveries to his shop and customers. Napolini attended the Lower Balingup School where he learnt to speak English and made friends with the other children.

During the second world war, many Italian immigrants were interned as 'enemy aliens' and were sent to internment camps around the South West. Those whose wives were here, were left to run the farm or family business. While, of the men who were interned some were allowed out to work on farms and those left behind were able to grow vegetables for the camps.

Whilst the stories of every Balingup/ Mullalyup family could not be collected, it is hoped you enjoy reading about the journey of these courageous people.

Many of these families are still living in our community

#### Vale Vernon Daulby

26/09/1926 to 08/09/2022

Vern was born on the 26th September 1926 in Colonel Light Gardens in South Australia. Amidst WWII, Vern joined the Royal Australian Navy on the 4th of January 1944 at the age of 17. Based in Western Port Bay, Victoria, at HMAS Cerberus, Vern trained as a morse code expert. He was then seconded to the Army and trained at Canungra, QLD, before transferring to Naval Beach, setting up ship to shore communications.

In June 1945, Vern went to Borneo where he served on the HMAS Hobart and Warrnambool. He witnessed the American General MacArthur, the man in charge of all operations in the Pacific, be carried ashore from a naval barge. Unfortunately, Vern contracted malaria and was evacuated to Port Moresby in PNG. Vern was discharged from service on the 5th December 1946.

After the war Vern met his wife Elizabeth (now deceased, 27/5/1925 to 04/09/2022) at a dance is Yorktown, South Australia. He followed Elizabeth back to WA and they were married in 1951. Soon after, they moved to Mullewa where Vern was the postal clerk and Elizabeth, a nurse. There they had there first two children, Jan & Garry.

In 1955, Vern and Elizabeth moved to Bridgetown where their third child, Terri was born. Vern was in charge of the Post Office until his retirement in 1986. He was a Life member of the Bridgetown RSL

and member of the Bridgetown Club and Bridgetown Golf Club. Vern and Elizabeth's legacy are their 3 children, 11 grandchildren and 13 great children.

We will always be grateful to Vern for his service, his character, sense of humour, stories and his contribution to our community.

## Shipping container scam victims drowning in losses

Losses to shipping container scams in WA have escalated to a total of \$375,000 so far this year, prompting a renewed urgent warning.

WA ScamNet at Consumer Protection has received 79 reports from consumers about numerous fake websites selling containers. A total of 60 victims have reported losses with the highest individual amount being \$35,000.

The fake websites that offer the containers at low prices are promoted via advertising on online classified websites such as Facebook Marketplace and Gumtree. The shipping containers are in high demand for storage or transport and can be converted into living quarters.

After purchasing online, the victims are sent an invoice requesting a direct bank transfer. Once paid, the container is never delivered. 
Then in the ensuing chase the determined farmers end up demolishing the site and felling the tree with digging equipment while attempting to dig Mr. Fox and his family out from the den.
