'Mitch Santiago' is a self-taught 17-year-old multi-instrumentalist from Perth. Mitch has released a series of songs amassing over 4 million streams including that of his new single, 'Talk to Me', written by Mitch and Oscar, now heading back for Blues at Bridgetown. We can't wait.

Frank Sultana is a modern-day Australian bluesman. Dripping with a pre-WW2 mojo, dark, dirty guitar tones and a voice that has the grit and soul of the characters and places he writes and sings about. Frank has been writing, recording and performing his original blues songs in Australia since his 2011 debut, 'Blues from the Lost Motel', and now has four EPs and eight albums under his belt.

Facelift at Bridgetown Freemasons Lodge

Over the past few months, the lawn area at the front of the Masonic Lodge building in Hampton Street has been transformed with a covering of paving.

The small grassed area which has been maintained for many years by volunteer Freemasons and most recently, for the last 30 years or so, by local resident Doug Lynn.

The ongoing increase in costs that affects us all has prompted the local Freemasons to rethink the purpose of this area, for current and future use.

The second-hand book sale the Freemasons hold every few months is well supported by Bridgetown residents and visitors. This enables the Lodge to continue to provide charitable support in various ways to the local community.

The members of the Bridgetown Lodge, led by Steve Norris, hatched a plan to pave the area. In the first instance to reduce maintenance costs and secondly, to offer the locals an alternative place to rest in our busy main street. By doing this, the Freemasons are giving back to all members of our community a pleasant place of rest.

Steve explains the significance of the paving design, "The area is paved to include a representation of what the inside of our Lodge room looks like. Four pillars are fixed in position with brief explanation of their significance to Freemasons. The black and white tiled design with its fringed edge is a typical pattern.

"The bench seating will be added for public use once it has been completed.

"The local Freemasons sincerely hope that residents and visitors will feel free to pause and rest for a while and enjoy the space. ...*Continued page 15*

What comes to mind when you hear the word disability?

A wheelchair, a guide dog, perhaps a cane or a hearing aid? You may have even had a little glimpse of what it may feel like. Those times you've injured yourself and need physical aids and others' help to navigate your day-to-day.

Generally, we adapt to the short-term knowing that things are going to get easier as we recover. Those "hards" we all have in life. Short term. Seasonal.

But what happens when things can't be "fixed" or "healed"? What happens when the short-term becomes permanent? Chronic exposure to the "hards". The landscape of life gets a little bit more challenging to navigate.

Those aisles in the supermarkets are permanently just that little bit narrow, the food on the top shelf just a bit out of reach. The labels are too tiny to read. That access friendly car spot out front of the store already taken and the walk to get necessities too far to be possible. Hearing or having a conversation with others in a busy coffee shop is seemingly impossible. The capacity to tell your story to another "system" is not there on the day perhaps you need it most.

As time goes on, the journey has the potential to make a person's world get smaller and smaller. Isolating. Excluding.

And we have only covered some of the physical. When we can see a person's challenges in front of our faces.

What about the disabilities we can't see? Like auto-immune diseases. Where one day a person seems fit and healthy, and the next, they are unable to get out of bed. We might see them parking in a disabled bay and make the comment "Why do you need this bay? You don't look disabled". Not realising that the outing will most likely see them in bed for the rest of the week recovering.

The list could go on. But we will stop there. What we really want to tell you about is how the Community Disability Advocacy Network, CDAN for short, has been nurtured to the point of action.

Bridgetown Historical Society

Early in September the Bridgetown Historical Society hosted the Royal Western Australian Historical Society 58th State History Conference of Affiliated Societies.

Delegates journeyed to Bridgetown from Perth and surrounding suburbs, from regional towns, Dongara, York, Albany, Denmark and many others.

The delegates, 120 in number were delighted with our library for the conference venue which provided a comfortable, light, airy, spacious setting. Many thanks to the library staff for accommodating the disruption to their usual activities and to the library users who were not able to access their library during Friday afternoon or Saturday morning.

Thanks also to the Shire staff who delivered the extra chairs needed, rolled all the library bookshelves to one side and set out the chairs to provide the needed conference setting and then put it all back again to its normal arrangement.

The conference was opened on Saturday by Hon David Templeman and Jane Kelsbie MLA with a Welcome to Country by Elder Sandra Hill.

The conference presenters spoke on varied and interesting topics addressing the theme Moving Forward Looking Back - Elder Sandra Hill on "First Nations, their history and inclusiveness in museums", Peter Hall on "On Orchardring in Bridgetown", Philippa Rogers on "WA railway history to Bridgetown", Pat Scallan OAM on "Mining in Greenbushes, from tin to lithium", Tim Lynch on "The evolution of Bridgetown-growing a rural town", Dr Sally Paulin "The Donnelly Mill Project-recycling a mill town"

The Sunday session was started by Karen Hill, Mgr. VC with a paper "Heritage festivals for rural towns" and continued by Jordanna Rebbeck "Research on Kaniyang grinding stones"

Beverly Rebbeck on "Saving Indigenous Language", Bevan Carter and Richard Allen on "Joseph Smith-Convict, builder and civic leader", Mary Elgar on "Oral history-Voices sparking memories."

The Greenbushes Talison Lithium tour on Saturday afternoon was most popular, with other people opting for a flora/fauna walk with Dr Erica Shedley or a genealogy workshop with Bevan and Jennie Carter.

A Bridgetown History walk with Richard Allen was another option.

On Sunday afternoon many people enjoyed a lunch and talk by Emily Smith on cider making at The Cidery or the ever popular Bridgetown History walk with Richard Allen.

With a welcome gathering plus wine and nibbles on Friday night where the delegates were welcomed to Bridgetown by Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes CEO Tim Lynch and Shire President Jenny Mountford and the conference dinner on Saturday night, both held in the Junior Farmers Hall at the Bridgetown Showgrounds our visitors were offered a taste of life in "A mere country village."

Overall, the conference was an immense success with many positive comments from the delegates.

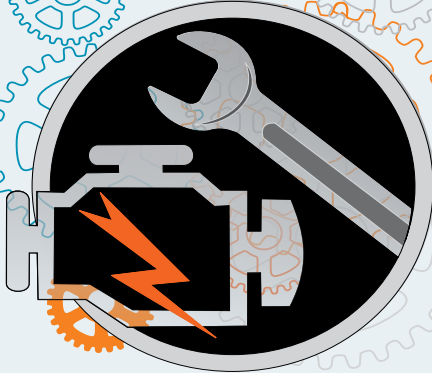

TALISON – SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITY

Craig's Corner-with Craig Dawson

With the advent of some finer weather it's great to see the completion of the Stanifer Street roadworks to facilitate safe access into the new Mine Services Area (MSA). Lighting and line marking should be completed in early October.

Talison Lithium Pty Ltd (**Talison**) in conjunction with the South West Development Commission, Aurizon and Arc Infrastructure has continued a series of community consultations with communities along the path of the Greenbushes to Bunbury rail line. The sessions provide an overview of, and information in relation to, the Detailed Feasibility Study (DFS) being coordinated by Talison to investigate a possible reopening of the railway line for transportation of lithium mineral concentrate from the Greenbushes Lithium Operation (**Site, Mine**) to the Port of Bunbury. Further meetings are planned and will be advertised in the coming months. A new page has been established on the Talison website to provide information about upcoming meetings and progress updates on the DFS. Feedback from the community consultations will be incorporated into the DFS and ultimately, the decision making process. Go to our website to find out more about the ways you can provide feedback.

The annual Mine Open Day will be upon us on Saturday 7 October. Participation in the Mine Tours has been overwhelming with the tours now fully booked out. If people missed out on booking a mine tour, the free family fun day at Thomson Park, Greenbushes, will still be a great event - with members of the community welcome to drop in on the day. There will be plenty of entertainment, stalls and displays.

Macmahon will have a truck simulator at the Open Day so you can see what it's like to drive a haulpak truck or try your hand at an excavator! The Open Day is an opportunity to see displays about the Mine's current operations and future expansion plans, and find out about career opportunities at the Mine.

Talison hosted a number of Mine visits during September including a visit by the full Board of Talison, a visit by the Bridgetown Historical Society Conference delegates and a visit by Tesla representatives.

In August, Talison was very proud and pleased to publish its inaugural Sustainability Report. The Sustainability Report

2022 covers the reporting period from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022 and is prepared with reference to Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) Standards. A copy is posted on our website.

Congratulations to Jamie Kennedy and Reuben Quill who both achieved a five(5) year service milestone during September.

Expansion activities at the Mine continue at pace:

- construction of the new MSA is all but complete with the mining team and new mining contractor Macmahon eagerly looking forward to starting to make the transition to the facility in the coming weeks;
- construction of the new Tailings Storage Facility #4 (**TSF4**) is picking up pace again with some improved weather;
- construction of Chemical Grade Plant #3 (**CGP3**) continues with bulk earthworks nearing completion, civil works at the crusher continuing and piling activities continuing. The plant is still on track for commissioning in the first half of 2025;
- construction of the temporary accommodation camp south of the Mine along Maranup Ford Road is progressing with occupancy expected to commence during October/November.

Processing activities continue at pace with all four (4) processing plants operating at capacity, with the Mine on track to achieve record production output for the 2023 year on the back of higher than expected ore grades being delivered by the mining team. Recruitment of operators for the next processing plant (CGP3) which is due to come on stream in the first half of 2025 is expected to commence during the fourth quarter.

Mining activities are ramping up as Macmahon gets settled in and new equipment is delivered. Material movements need to increase significantly over the next four (4) months from 600,000 bank cubic metres per month (**bcm/mth**) to 1,200,000 bcm/mth.

Talison has a well established Traineeship and Apprenticeship Programme and as the Mine develops, it has always been Talison's intent to increase the number of traineeships and apprenticeships offered. For the 2024 year, Talison is looking to offer 13 Traineeships and three (3) new Apprenticeships (bringing the total number of Apprentices on site to 12). Advertising for these opportunities has commenced so please keep an eye out for the advertising and spread the word.

Pharmacy R U OK? Day

R U OK? Day was held on Thursday 14 September, which is our National Day of Action dedicated to reminding everyone that any day is the right day to ask, 'Are you OK?' to support those struggling with life.

Pharmacy intern Sehaj Johal, someone who has been a supporter of R U OK Day all through her schooling years and has loved wearing the yellow T-Shirt, convinced Pharmacy owner Kevin Tay to hold the R U OK? Day at the pharmacy. On the day, patients and customers were invited to place 'stick-it' notes on a wall with their responses to two main themes: ideas on What brings you joy, and What do you do to improve your mental health.

Sehaj and Kevin were very pleased with the response to the event, extending the one-day event to continue for the week.

A very delighted Sehaj tells us how the day unfolded, "Now that I've been working at the pharmacy for a while, I've got to know our patients and customers quite well, so when I approached them to inform them about R U OK? Day I was delighted with their response as they were comfortable talking to me

"They responded well when asked to write the different messages on the wall, and then when asked, 'Are you really OK?' for some it allowed them to take that mask off and have a real chat.

"I think the power of starting a conversation about wellbeing, and having it early and frequently is so important.

"For some, just listening to their answers, gave them a feeling of being heard as well as a great opportunity to talk, and for those who I thought were struggling I could encourage and refer them to seek further help with the appropriate health professionals.

"Some of the important health steps we also encouraged people to undertake in maintaining good mental health regime is to eat well, sleep well and to exercise, spend time with loved ones and do things they love"

R U OK? was started by Gavin Larkin OAM. Gavin, an advertising executive, had lost his father to suicide and passionately wanted to do something to prevent others experiencing this loss.

Gavin was collaborating with TV Producer Janina Nearn on a documentary to raise awareness, but soon realised the documentary alone wouldn't be enough.

To genuinely change behaviour Australia-wide, a national campaign was needed. From this realisation, and with Gavin and Janina's expertise and passion, R U OK? was born and launched in 2009.

R U OK? is a harm prevention charity that uses health promotion to encourage people to have conversations that help others through difficult times in their lives.

It relates to suicide prevention through fostering social connection and building the capacity of informal support networks – friends, family and colleagues - to be alert to those around them and be able to identify signs of distress or difficulty.

This creates a stronger first point of contact to address and de-escalate distress. It also demonstrates that others are there to help, therefore countering notions of isolation and aloneness that can foster suicidal thoughts.
